SUPPORTING CONTINUED FEDERAL MANAGEMENT AND STEWARDSHIP OF PUBLIC LANDS WITHIN GRANT COUNTY

WHEREAS, public lands, managed by federal agencies such as the U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, and the Bureau of Land Management, are deeply valued for their recreational, economic, cultural, and spiritual significance, by the citizens of Grant County who want these lands accessible to all; and

WHEREAS, the costs associated with managing these lands are a national responsibility, and federal involvement is crucial for the long-term health and sustainability of these resources; and

WHEREAS, there are ongoing attempts to transfer or sell off public lands, which are inconsistent with the importance of multiple uses of public lands, including but not limited to, grazing, energy development, and recreation:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Grant County Board of Commissioners hereby:

- 1. Expresses its strong support for the continued federal management and stewardship of public lands opposing efforts to sell, transfer or dispose of these public lands within Grant County.
- 2. Encourages the New Mexico Congressional Delegation to oppose any legislation that would negatively impact public lands and fully fund our public lands and oppose any attempts to change the Antiquities Act or reduce the size of our national monuments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the members of the New Mexico Congressional Delegation, the Governor of New Mexico, and the relevant federal land management agencies.
